

the FY 2021 State Budget, shared with Satellite Beach, in the amount of \$1M. In FY 2022, for this project, we will continue to pursue other supplemental funding from the St. John's River Water Management District and the Florida Inland Navigation District.

Indian Harbour Beach's efforts to restore and protect the Indian River Lagoon also includes continued funding for street sweeping to remove harmful nutrients from roadways before it has the opportunity to enter the lagoon, the development of a rain barrel rebate program for homes and businesses to capture harmful roof runoff, as well as proposing to utilize Stormwater Assessment funds and any subsequent grant funds for a second baffle box to further reduce harmful nitrogen and phosphorous and debris from entering the lagoon.



The Indian Harbour Beach parks and beaches are another shining example of the quality of life our citizens enjoy year round. The Mayor, City Council and the Executive Team are committed to providing world class parks and recreation opportunities for the community. In FY 2022, the City Council has prioritized the development of a community driven Master Plan for the Algonquin Sports Complex to enhance recreational opportunities, especially for the youth of the community. The City has made application to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity for a 2021-22 Community Planning Technical Assistance Grant in the amount of \$43,000 to utilize the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council to develop this Master Plan.

Due to COVID-19, City-sponsored events and activities at the Recreation Center were reduced or eliminated. As stated earlier, staff initiated a budget build for FY 2022 with the return of quality programs; however, in a sensible and safe manner. Your Recreation team is working hard to determine safe and appropriate programs for the community. High attended events including the Annual Art Show, swimming lessons and summer camp are returning in a scaled back version. It is anticipated other events and programs, such as Halloween Trunk or Treat, Christmas in the Park and Breakfast with the Easter Bunny will return in this budget year.

Gleason Park is one of our shining stars and has provided a phenomenal opportunity for the public to social distance while enjoying the outdoors and getting exercise. As our municipal pool, parks and beaches have opened up again, we see the community out relishing in the beauty of these facilities that our Recreation and Public Works teams work tirelessly to maintain in an exemplary manner.
